Amendments to the By-laws of the Cosmetology Association of Nova Scotia made by the Cosmetology Association of Nova Scotia under Section 17 of Chapter of the Acts of 2012, the Cosmetology Act

1. The by-laws of the Cosmetology Association of Nova Scotia are amended by:

A) Adding to by-law 4.1:

Specific (Technical Cutting)

A person who successfully completed 800 hours of theory and practical instruction as required in the Act and these by-laws or has sufficient work experience in the capacity for which the licence is sought to write the examination without further occupational training and pays the fees required by these by-laws shall be issued a Specific Licence (Technical Cutting). This licence permits the person to perform the act of cutting of hair by shaving, or with scissors, clippers, trimmers, or razor.

B). Adding to By-law 4.1

Specific Licence (Facial Waxing)

A person who successfully completed 100 hours of theory and practical instruction as required in the Act and these by-laws or has sufficient work experience in the capacity for which the licence is sought to write the examination without further occupational training and pays the fees required by these by-laws shall be issued a Specific Licence (Facial Waxing). This licence permits the person to perform the act of hair removal from the face only, by waxing.

C) Adding to By-law 4.1

Specific Licence (Esthetics Skincare)

A person who successfully completed 800 hours of theory and practical instruction as required in the Act and these by-laws or has sufficient work experience in the capacity for which the licence is sought to write the examination without further occupational training and pays the fees required by these by-laws shall be issued a Specific Licence (Esthetic Skincare). This licence permits the person to perform the provision of bodily skincare (including the face) by any act prescribed in the Regulations.
