CLINICAL ESTHETICS

Curriculum Outline & Licensing Requirements

- 1. A fully licensed esthetician must complete a minimum of six (6) consecutive months active work in a registered salon, providing skincare services.
- 2. File an application with the Cosmetology Association for a Clinical Esthetics licence.
- 3. Clinical Estheticians are required to complete four (4) Association approved upgrade modules and three (3) years' active work in registered salon providing clinical services to be eligible for a Master Clinical Licence.
- 4. File an application with the Cosmetology Association for a Master Clinical Esthetician licence. A Clinical Esthetician must have completed and successfully passed four (4) Association approved upgrade modules and have completed three (3) years' active work in a registered salon or spa to become licensed as a Master Clinical Esthetician.
- 5. A Master Clinical Esthetician must complete two (2) years' active work providing clinical services in a registered salon to be eligible for Master Clinical Instructor licence.

APPROVED UPGRADE MODULES

Requirements 1 to 3 may be taken in any order. Module 4 must be taken when requirements 1 to 3 are completed.
